Girls and women without jobs, who, for various reasons, are unable to return to the labour market straightaway and without assistance, receive professional support from the Public Employment Service, but that only covers qualification and further training. The idea behind this project was that an expert should help those girls and women resolve their problems. The participants in the training programmes were supported with regard to family-related and financial problems as well as issues such as addiction, long-term unemployment or leisure and holiday activities. During the training stage they could turn to a professional social worker who helped them set and co-ordinate goals and find solutions for conflicts troubling them.

The *Partnership* project aims at the permanent integration into the regular labour market of unemployed young adults aged 18 to 24 who have an immigration background. Tests and qualification modules are offered in three areas (service sector / tourism, technology / construction-related industries, health and social care / nursing) in order to help the participants decide which type of job or training is best for them. They may acquire certificates such as a fork-lift licence or German language certificates (levels A1 to B1), and they may complete lower secondary schooling in individual subjects, which improves their chances of obtaining training or finding work. The project comprises six training courses of 24 weeks each, which are held in two locations (city of Salzburg and Zell am See).

ABC-Café is a low-threshold educational provision for women. Participants get together once a week under the guidance of an experienced trainer. In a relaxed, cafe-style atmosphere they may practise and consolidate their German language skills; in addition, a number of workshops are held, focusing on subjects such as the school system, health care and immigration policy / law.

Apart from the *ABC-Café* meetings, German language courses are organised, with levels ranging from literacy courses to German A1 + .

In 2010 cafes were run in four Tyrolean towns (Reutte, Imst, Zams, Schwaz), addressing female immigrants living in the Tyrol who are no Austrian nationals, who are not entitled to subsidiary protection and have not been granted refugee status.

Integration into the labour market and occupational development are important factors for leading an independent life. In order to close existing gaps in the support and qualification system for persons entitled to subsidiary protection or asylum in the Tyrol, BFI Tyrol, in cooperation with the local refugee co-ordination office and the Public Employment Service, initiated the project *PolePosition*, which was implemented for the first time in 2007–2008 as a pilot project.

To start with, the project participants attend German language courses, after which they take the ÖSD level A2 language exam. Then they may obtain vocational training in one of three fields: electrical industry / metalwork / warehousing, catering / tourism or trade / sales. This specialised training stage also includes vocational orientation with a view to finding work placements and jobs for the participants.

During the summer months of 2010 and 2011 around 36 students from the schools of BFI Vienna do a placement in companies of neighbouring countries: in the Czech Republic (Brno), Slovakia (Bratislava) and Hungary (Győr, Székesfehérvár, Budapest). Before this, specific workshops are held to prepare the participants for their placement by familiarising them with the culture and language of the respective host countries.
